Administration of Medication by School Staff

The John McGivney Children's Centre School Authority is committed to ensuring a safe, accepting and healthy learning environment which supports student well-being and empowers students with health/medical needs to reach their full potential.

TERMINOLOGY:

Prescription Medication: a medication that is available only with written authorization and instructions from a qualified health care professional (e.g. medical doctor or nurse practitioner).

Pro Re Nata (PRN) Medication: prescription medication that is to be administered to students on an "as needed" (PRN) basis.

Non Prescription Medication: a medication that is available "over the counter" and that does not require written authorization or instructions from a qualified health care professional.

The JMCCSA believes that parents/guardians have the primary responsibility for the administration of medication to their children and wherever possible this medication should be given at home.

The JMCCSA recognizes that designated staff member(s) appointed by the Principal, shall administer prescription medication when necessary and on an ongoing basis in accordance with applicable administrative procedures.
