# **Active Learning Strategies**

Active Learning is an approach to learning for children with multiple disabilities and visual impairments, developed by Dr. Lilli Nielson. The goal is to provide opportunities for children to actively explore and discover their environment. Through active learning children can develop fine motor skills, handeye coordination, spatial awareness and an understanding of cause and effect. The learning is endless!



#### **5 Principles of Active Learning:**

- 1. Let your child guide their own play
- 2. Provide plenty of opportunities and time to engage in the play
- 3. Choose materials that are appropriate for your child's skills
- 4. Choose materials that your child is interested in (e.g., certain textures, sounds, etc.)
- 5. Limit any distractions. Shh.. learning is in progress!

- · remote controlled vehicles
- dolls or stuffed animals with push buttons on the hand, foot, or stomach
- · light projectors
- fans
