WHAT WE ARE LEARNING...

We have been very busy in Class 4 exploring our outdoor environment and using nature to help make observations and collect data. During our science lessons, we have been watching to see how much rain we can collect weekly. Students have been making observations on "more or less" rain and "colour" of the rain.

During Literacy rotations, students have continued to work on various activities that promote letter and sound recognition, rhyming patterns, and hands on literacy activities where students are practicing writing different letters. In our writing rotations, we have been practicing sequencing the sentences "I like the..." and "I see a....". Students have been doing a great job using their preferred communication to make different word lists.

Our Math focus is recognizing shapes through identifying the number of sides. Class 4 has been having fun creating shapes in a variety of ways. For example, we have some students who have used toothpicks and marshmallows to make different 2D shapes. We will continue to practice identifying shapes through a variety of activities, such as sorting by size, or number of sides.

As we move into the month of November, we will be looking at different community helpers that we see. We will be reading stories, singing songs and learning about the important role they play within the community.

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
